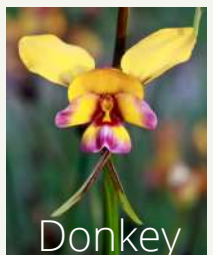
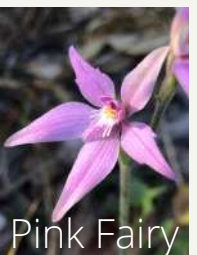

WILDFLOWERS

OF THE SHIRE OF KOORDA

The wide diversity of flora in the Shire of Koorda makes for a wonderful wildflower hunt during the winter months. Orchids shelter in the wetter areas, while wattles, bottlebrush, and various types of cassias line the roadsides alongside the Shire's own Koorda Rose (Darwinia Rosea). Come and explore the region and its wonderful colours in wildflower season (July-September).

The reserves to visit:

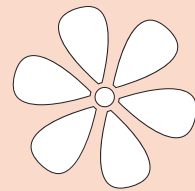

Orchids

- White Spider (most common)

Other Wildflowers

- Koorda rose (Darwinia Rosea)
- Everlastings (Rhodanthe chlorocephala)
- Feather Plant (Pink Verticordia)
- Tinsel Bush (Cyanostegia angustifolia)

Orchids favour wet, hidden spots that will protect their fragile structures. They are often small.

Try looking at the base of rocks or in the wet undergrowth.

Previous sightings: Mollerin rock, Badgerin Rock, Soaks, Newcarlbeon

Other Wildflowers

- Hakea (Hakea coriacea)
- Bottlebrush (Calistamon)
- Feather Plant (Pink Verticordia)
- Tinsel Bush (Cyanostegia angustifolia)

Koorda's floral emblem, the **Koorda Rose**, and other native bushflowers can be found in large numbers in the Wildflower Park (Mulji Rd).

Bushflowers can be found along the roadside, particularly along the Koorda-Mollerin and Burakin- Wialki East roads.

Other interesting sights

- Gnamma holes
- Granite rock
- Echidna holes/ Echidna
- Wedgetail Eagle
- Kangaroos

Gnammas: Newcarlbeon Reserve, Moningarin Soak, Nugget Waterhole.

Granite Rocks (large): Mt Collier (unusual rock dam), Mollerin Rock, Newcarlbeon Reserve.

Echidna: Reserves and roadsides
Wedgetail eagle: Reserves and roadsides

Kangaroos: Reserves and roadsides
